Show Me a Sign!

We do not see our signs; there is no longer a prophet, and there is none among us who knows how long.

(Psalms 74:9)

5:5

Raging Waters

Many waters cannot extinguish the love, nor can rivers wash it away. (Song of Songs 8:7)

5:6

Tools of the Trade

The silversmith uses tongs to hold hot metal and form it into tools and vessels.

(Talmud, Pesachim 54a)

5:7

Wisdom of Experience

An elder (zakein) is one who has acquired wisdom (zeh shekana chachmah). (Talmud, Kiddushin 32b)

5:8

Judicial Agony

A judge who tarries with matters that are obvious, in order to torture one of the litigants—this is included in the Biblical prohibition against "committing an injustice during a trial" (Leviticus 19:15).

5:10

Giving Freely

You shall not take from him interest or increase, and you shall fear your G-d. (*Leviticus 25:36*)

Fostering Independence

There are eight levels of charity, each greater than the next.

The greatest level, above which there is no greater, is to support a fellow Jew by endowing him with a gift or loan, or entering into a partnership with him, or finding employment for him, in order to strengthen his hand until he need no longer be dependent upon others...

(Rambam, Mishneh Torah, Hilchot Tzedakah 10:7)

You Go First

Rabbi Natan said: What prompted the leaders to donate first for the dedication of the Altar, and not for the construction of the Tabernacle? They said, "Let the community donate what they will donate, and whatever they are missing we will complete"... Because they were initially idle a letter "yud" is missing from their name.

Giving Back

May He bless... those who establish synagogues for prayer, and those who come there to pray, those who provide lights for illumination, wine for Kiddush and havdalah, food for the wayfarers and charity for the needy, and all who occupy themselves faithfully with communal affairs...

True Love
