Redeeming the Firstborn

Exodus: 4:22

אָמַרְתָּ אֶל פַּרְעֹה כֹּה אָמַר יְהֹוָה בְּנִי בְכֹרִי יִשְׂרָאֵל And you shall say to Pharaoh, 'So said the Lord, "My firstborn son is Israel."

Numbers: 18:15

However, you shall redeem the firstborn of man

Maimonides: Positive Commandment # 80

The 80th *mitzvah* is that we are commanded to redeem a first-born male and to give the redemption value to a *kohen*.

The source of this commandment is G-d's statement, "Give Me the first-born of your sons." The explanation of this "giving" is that we must redeem him as if the *kohen* already owns him. We acquire the child from the *kohen* by giving him five *selah*.

The source of this commandment is G-d's statement, "You must redeem a first-born male child."

This *mitzvah* is called *pidyon haben*. Women are not obligated in this *mitzvah*; it is the child's *mitzvah* which the father must fulfill, as explained in *Kiddushin*.

The details of this *mitzvah* are explained in tractate *B*'choros.

Levites are exempt from this *mitzvah*.
